SUBJECT:	REVIEW OF POLLING DISTRICTS AND POLLING
	PLACES

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. The premises set out in Annex 1 be designated the polling places for the polling districts stated with effect from 1st December 2011; and
- 2. The Officers be asked to pursue the provision of ramps where appropriate to improve accessibility.

SUMMARY

This report sets out the proposals for polling districts and polling places in the Borough following the statutory review undertaken under the Electoral Administration Act 2006.

Statutory Powers

- 1. The last review of polling districts and polling places was carried out in 2007 and reported to Council at their meeting held on 6th December 2007. A range of identified problems were, as a result, resolved. The Electoral Administration Act, 2006 introduced a duty for all polling districts and polling places to be reviewed by the end of 2007 and thereafter at least every four years. In conducting a statutory review Local Authorities are required to demonstrate they have met the criteria set out in the legislation as follows:
 - Seek to ensure that all electors in the constituency have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances.
 - Seek to ensure that so far as is reasonable and practicable, the polling places they are responsible for are accessible to all electors, including those who are disabled, and when considering the designation of a polling place must have regard to the accessibility needs of disabled persons.
- 2. Electoral matters are reserved to the Council to determine.

Review Process

- 3. In accordance with statutory requirements the Council gave notice of the review and sought comments from a wide range of stakeholders including:
 - The Acting Returning Officers for Parliamentary Constituencies within the Borough
 - All Councillors
 - o County Council Divisional Councillors for Reigate and Banstead
 - Surrey County Council
 - o Horley Town Council
 - Salfords and Sidlow Parish Council
 - o M.Ps for Reigate and Banstead
 - Political Parties
 - o Residents Associations
- 4. The Review information was also available via the Council's web site for public consultation.
- 5. As part of the review process Officers have considered all existing arrangements against a range of criteria including:
 - Convenience for electors
 - Accessibility
 - Car parking
 - Facilities for staff
 - Health & Safety
- 6. The only representations received were regarding matters which were outside the scope of this review and were in relation to requests for changes in the current Ward boundaries.

As indicated in paragraph 1, most identified problems have been resolved as part of the previous 2007 review.

Accessibility Issues

- 7. The following Polling Place has problems with accessibility. As no suitable alternative exists the Officers propose that the installation of ramps should be investigated to mitigate these accessibility issues:
 - o Furzefield School, Delabole Road, Merstham

Notwithstanding the above the Officers still have concerns regarding access for the elderly and/or disabled electors at the Meadvale Parish Room polling place in Somerset Road, Redhill. However, owing to the proximity of the entrance to the highway it is not possible to have a ramped access. Alternative venues have been looked at and are either unavailable or unsuitable.

9. Review of County Electoral Divisions

This review is taking place at the moment and will be finalised by March 2012. The current suggestions for the Electoral Divisions within the Borough will mean that several of the existing polling districts will be split. This will mean that a further review of polling districts and polling places will have to be conducted after March 2012 in order to take into account any changes. This review will have to be completed and agreed by Council before the publication of the Register of Electors on 1st December 2012. The new County Electoral Divisions will come into force at the County Council Elections scheduled to be held in May 2013.

Legal Implications

10. There are no specific legal implications arising from this report.

Resource Implications

11. The need for a further review as set out in paragraph 9 above and any subsequent increase in the number of polling places will increase the revenue costs – see separate report set out under agenda item 10. In addition, there will be costs associated with the provision of ramps but these have yet to be assessed.

Consultation

12. Consultation has been undertaken as set out in paragraph 3 of this report.

Conclusions

13. The Council is obliged to have suitable arrangements in place in order to provide voting facilities for all the electors of the Borough. The process of review is ongoing and Officers will continue to pursue alternative more suitable premises where existing premises fall below the standards sought by the Council.
