SUBJECT: REVIEW OF POLLING DISTRICTS

### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- 1. The changes to polling district boundaries including the establishment of a new Polling District Kingswood with Burgh Heath (EA1) as detailed in Annex 1 to this report and shown on plans referenced CHW1/12; KB1/12; RC1/12; MStJ1/12; EW1/12 and HC1/12 be approved and adopted to coincide with the republication of a Register of Electors in 2013 reflecting the new County electoral Divisions; and
- 2. To note that, on grounds of urgency, the Electoral Registration Officer has, under paragraph 1.15 of the Officer Scheme of Delegation within the Constitution, designated St Luke's Church, Church Road, Reigate as the polling place for Polling District South Park and Woodhatch (NA) from 1 September 2012.

### **SUMMARY**

Arising from changes to the County electoral Divisions, this report sets out proposals for certain polling districts in the Borough following a review undertaken under the Electoral Administration Act 2006 to ensure they are co-terminus with the County Divisions. No changes to Ward boundaries are involved.

### **Statutory Powers**

1. The Electoral Administration Act, 2006, in addition to requiring a review of polling districts and polling places at least every four years from 2007, also provides for additional periodic reviews as the need arises. The last statutory four year review was in 2011.

2. Electoral matters are reserved to the Council to determine.

### Background

- 3. As part of the 2011 review referred to in paragraph 1, it was reported that a further review would be required in 2012 arising from the establishment of new County electoral Divisions from May 2013.
- 4. Specifically, Members will recall that the County boundary review results (from May 2013) in the number of Divisions in the Borough increasing from 9 to 10. This increase is not limited to one particular area and has the affect of changing a number of previous electoral Divisions.
- 5. A further consequence is that the County Divisions will no longer be coterminus with a number of the polling Districts within the Borough Council Wards.
- 6. If left unchanged some polling stations for County Council elections would have to issue different ballot papers to certain electors depending on which electoral Division they were in. In essence affected electors would be voting at a polling place that was not in the relevant electoral Division. This would result in that polling place having to provide separate ballot boxes for each electoral Division. The situation would be further complicated in the event of a dual election. Making County Divisional and Borough district boundaries coterminous is therefore strongly recommended.
- 7. Affected Wards are Chipstead, Hooley and Woodmansterne, Kingswood with Burgh Heath, Reigate Central, Meadvale and St. John's, Earlswood and Whitebushes and Horley Central.
- 8. To resolve this, in March 2012, officers commenced a review of polling Districts and the resultant proposals have since been on display in the Members office at the Town Hall, Reigate. The proposals have also been the subject of formal consultation.

### **Review Criteria**

- 9. As indicated, a statutory review of all polling Districts and polling places was completed in 2011 and this took into account established criteria such as accessibility, health and safety, car parking and facilities for staff etc.
- 10. The criteria for this additional review has therefore focussed on the need to establish coterminous County Division and Borough District polling boundaries (to avoid the situation referred to in paragraph 6) whilst ensuring minimal disruption to current polling arrangements and maintaining convenience for electors.

### **Review Options**

- 11. In conducting the review two main options were considered:
  - Option 1 (the preferred option) to amend the internal boundaries of the affected Wards i.e. the polling districts in order that they match the County Divisional boundaries
  - Option 2 to create new polling districts in order to match the County Divisional boundaries

### **Review Process**

- 12. In accordance with statutory requirements the Council gave notice of the review and sought comments from a wide range of stakeholders. The Review information was also available via the Council's web site for public consultation.
- 13. The consultation period ran from 16 July 2012 to 27 August 2012 but no representations on or objections to the proposals have been received.

### **Review Proposals**

- 14. In formulating recommendations it has been possible to follow the preferred option 1 (see paragraph 11) in all but one instance. The exception is within the Kingswood with Burgh Heath Ward where it is proposed to create a new polling district EA1 (option 2) in preference to a "shift" of existing District boundaries.
- 15. A schedule detailing all the recommendations in relation to future polling district boundaries of the affected Wards is set out in Annex 1 to this report. A summary map is set out at Annex 2. Detailed maps referenced CHW1/12; KB1/12; RC1/12; MStJ1/12; EW1/12 and HC1/12 are on deposit in the Members' Room.
- 16. No changes to Ward boundaries are involved and there is no impact on the number of electors within Borough Wards

### Designation of Polling Place for South Park and Woodhatch (Polling District NA)

- 17. The Council was recently notified that Sandcross Infant School, which has been used as a double polling station in the South Park and Woodhatch Ward, is moving to the junior school site in November. As a result it will no longer be available for use as a polling place.
- 18. There will be Police and Crime Commissioner elections across the Borough on 15 November 2012 and it has therefore been necessary to designate an alternative polling place as a matter of urgency to ensure planning arrangements for this election are not affected.
- 19. Two alternative polling places have been considered namely The Sovereign Centre, Sliphatch Road, Reigate and St. Luke's Church, Church Road, Reigate. Both premises were deemed suitable as a polling place but having regard to availability, level of usage and potential disruption to the local community, it was felt that St Luke's Church had advantages over The Sovereign Centre.

20. Following appropriate consultation on the proposal (no objections were received) the Electoral Registration Officer has, under paragraph 1.15 of the Officer Scheme of Delegation within the Constitution, now designated St Luke's Church, Church Road, Reigate as the polling place for Polling District South Park and Woodhatch (NA) from 1 September 2012. This decision was taken on grounds of urgency.

### **Legal Implications**

21. There are no specific legal implications arising from this report.

### **Resource Implications**

22. None.

### Consultation

23. Consultation has been undertaken as set out in paragraph 12 of this report.

### **Conclusions**

24. For reasons set out in paragraph 6 it is important that the boundaries of County electoral Divisions are coterminous with those of Borough District boundaries. Changes to the County electoral Divisions from May 2013 will result in the loss of some coterminous boundaries and a review of a number of Polling Districts has been undertaken under the Electoral Administration Act 2006. Proposals have subsequently been prepared that ensure District and County Division boundaries are coterminous. No changes to Ward boundaries are involved.


