### **LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE**

Minutes of a meeting of the Licensing Sub-Committee held at the Town Hall, Reigate on Tuesday, 31st May, 2005 at 10.00 a.m.

#### **1. LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE – PROCEDURE RULES**

**RESOLVED** to note the Procedure Rules for meetings of the Licensing Sub-Committee.

#### **2. APPLICATION FOR VARIATION OF PREMISES LICENCE – THE BARLEY MOW, 3 EASTNOR ROAD, REIGATE**

The Sub-Committee received a report on an application to vary an existing Justices Licence for the Barley Mow Public House, Reigate.

The Sub-Committee followed the recently adopted procedure for the consideration of applications under the Licensing Act 2003 taking account of the statement of licensing policy that had been adopted by the Council.

The Sub-Committee were addressed by the Licensing Officer, the applicant's representatives and other interested parties (objectors who had registered to speak).

Questions were put to the Licensing Officer, applicant's representative and other interested parties.

As part of the applicant's representative's summing up he offered to the Sub-Committee a number of suggested amendments in response to the representations that had been received.

On completion of hearing all the representations, questions/answers and summing up from all parties, the Sub-Committee adjourned to deliberate its decision from 11.04 a.m. to 11.38 a.m. On return the Chairman announced the Sub-Committee's decision and it was

**RESOLVED** that the application for a variation of the existing Justices Licence for the Barley Mow, 3 Eastnor Road, Reigate be granted as set out in the application

subject to the following additional conditions that were offered by the applicant's representative:-

- (a) live music will only be permitted on up to twelve occasions per year;
- (b) there shall be no live music after 11.00 p.m. and the garden will cease operation at 10.00 p.m.;
- (c) the live music will be audible at the nearest residential premises from 10.00 p.m. and shall be no more than barely audible at the boundary of any residential property apart from the licensed premises; and
- (d) a further condition on a degree of signage on the premises relating to car parking and the requirement for customers to leave quietly.
