The Dog & Duck Public House, High Street, Redhill was subject to a review by the licensing authority on 30th March 2012. This review was instigated by Surrey Police due to public order and drug related problems at the premises.

At this review hearing the licensing authority added eleven conditions to the premises licence, In addition three undertakings were accepted.

At a multi agency visit to the premises on Friday 13th July 2012 it was established that eight of the eleven conditions were being breached and two of the undertakings were being breached. It was also noted that the premises licence was not being correctly displayed and the Designated Premises supervisor had failed to notify the licensing authority of a change of address.

Offences under the Consumer protection from unfair consumer trading regulations, The Intoxicating Liquor Regulations 1988. and The Companies Act 2006 were also revealed.

The conditions were added to the licence in March in order to ensure the premises were operated in line with the licensing objectives, The continued trading otherwise than in accordance with the conditions would indicate that management are unable to operate in a manor consistant with the licensing objectives.

Police therefore seek the revocation of the premises licence.

**BREACHED CONDITIONS, UNDERTAKINGS AND OFFENCES,
CONDITIONS.**

1. Save in an emergency a personal licence holder must be on the premises on Friday and Saturday nights from 1800 hours to closing when licensable activity is taking place or when there are organised events taking place.

Breach - This condition was breached at 2105hrs on Saturday 19th May. Statement provided by PC 40377 Clements (page 1)

2. Condition complied with.

3. The age verification policy required by the mandatory conditions shall specify the age of 25 instead of 18 so as to require that any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall be asked to provide proof of age in the required format when seeking admission to the premises and before being sold or served alcohol. A refusals log is to be maintained and made available to any responsible authority upon request.

Breach - During visit on 13th July No refusals log could be produced. Door staff were not seen to check any IDs. There were no posters/signs on display either at the point of sale or point of entry. Statement provided by PC 40024 Stevens (page 4).

4. Three SIA approved door supervisors to be on duty at all times on the premises during the following periods: From 2000 hours until all customers have left the premises on any Friday or Saturday.

Breach - At 2105hrs on Friday 19th May, 2050hrs on Friday 15th June and 2015hrs on Friday 13th July only two door staff were on duty. Statement provided by PC 40377 Clements for the 19th May and PC 40377 Clements (page 1) and PC 3029 Ferris (page 1).

5. An incident log shall be kept at the premises. A record of all incidents relating to crime and disorder and anti-social behaviour shall be logged showing the date and time of the incident, details of the nature of the incident and the individual(s) involved and the name of the member of staff involved. The log shall be kept up to date and on the premises at all times and made available for inspection on request by officers of the Licensing Authority and/or Police.

Breach - During the visit on 13th July a diary was produced however this did not record any incidents but had details of upcoming pub watch meetings. The diary was not readily available behind the bar, but took at least 15 minutes to produce, and appeared to be the premises diary rather than an incident log. Statement by Licensing Officer 12838 Hume (page 1)

6. At each exit located at the premises, signs shall be erected which are easily visible to customers and which request customers to leave quietly. The size, lettering, wording and location of such signs shall be agreed in writing with the Licensing Authority by 1 June 2012.

Breach - During the visit on 13th July it was noted that no signs were in position Statement provided by Licensing Officer 12838 Hume (page 1) and PC 40024 Stevens (Page 4)

7. The premises licence holder shall implement a zero tolerance drug policy that includes signs placed visibly at all entrances to the premises and visibly in both the male and female toilets. The signs shall indicate that no illegal drugs are allowed on the premises and that anyone being found in possession of such drugs will be ejected from the premises. The zero tolerance drug policy to be agreed with Surrey Police by 1 June 2012.

Breach - A Drug Policy has not been submitted to Surrey Police, and at the visit 13th July no signs were on display. During a visit on 6th July Police asked for a copy of the drug policy and the DPS stated he would e-mail a copy. Statement provided by PC 40024 Stevens (page 4)

8. When the premises is open for licensable activity, all public toilets to be checked not less than twice per hour. A record of these checks to be maintained and made available to any responsible authority requesting such record.

Breach - During the visit 13th July No toilet check record could be produced. Statement provided by PC 40024 Stevens (page 4) and Licensing Officer 12838 Hume (page 2)

9. SIA approved door supervisors, when employed at the premises, are to conduct searches of bags of customers seeking admission to the premises in order to deter and prevent illegal drugs from being brought onto the premises. In addition, as a condition of entry, those seeking entrance to the premises will be subject to a search of their person. This will be in accordance with the zero tolerance drug policy for the premises, a draft of which shall be supplied to Surrey Police within one month of the date of the hearing.

Breach - During the visit on 13th July door staff were not seen to do any searches. Statement provided by PC 40024 Stevens (page 4).

10. Condition complied with.

11. Plans are to be provided to the Licensing Authority by the premises Licence holder indicating a marked smoking area within one month of the date of this hearing. Once this defined smoking area has been approved by the responsible authorities, this area is to be controlled by at least one SIA approved Door Supervisor when employed at the premises when it is being used by any person. No customers shall be permitted to exit or enter the premises or the approved smoking area at any time carrying drinking glasses or glass bottles.

Breach - Plans have not yet been provided and during the visit on 13th July it was noted that persons were carrying glasses and drinking in the smoking area. Statement provided by PC 40024 Stevens (page 4).

UNDERTAKINGS,

1. Mr O'Mahoney to control use of the side door of the premises leading onto Cromwell Road and to ensure that it is used for no other purpose than as a fire exit after 2000 hrs on any night.

Breach - During the visit on 13th July 2015hrs to 2110hrs this door was found to be open. Statement provided by Licensing Officer 12838 Hume (page 1)

2. Mr O'Mahoney to secure an SIA badge by 1 June 2012. At the visit 13th July Mr O'Mahony stated he had taken the SIA course but had not yet received a badge.

Breach - A request has been submitted to the SIA Authority in order to check his status as of the 1st June 2012. Statement provided by PC 40024 Stevens (page 3)

Previous review hearing held 30th March 2012

The Dog and Duck Public House is located at 33 High Street, Redhill, Surrey. The front of the premises faces out onto a pedestrian area and parade of shops. On entering the premises, the bar is located directly in front of the entrance doors.

Surrey Police have called this review on the grounds of Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety

With regard to public safety, there have been a number of incidents involving assaults at the premises, some of which have involved the door staff. In addition there have been numerous incidents involving drugs at the premises. All of these incidents are explained in more detail on the attached summary.

In relation to the prevention of Crime and Disorder, Surrey Police have concerns regarding the lack of CCTV at the premises and the poor lighting inside the premises. In addition, there are concerns over the effectiveness of the door staff employed at the premises and of the overall general management of the premises.

On Friday 30 March 2012, The Council determined as follows:

Condition 1 to be removed.

Reason:

- The change of management role and undertaking of direct management by the current Designated Premises Supervisor.
- It was noted that the parties agreed this amendment.

Condition 2 to be amended as follows:

Save in emergency, a personal licence holder must be on the premises on Friday and Saturday nights from 1800 hours to closing when licensable activity is taking place or when there are organised events taking place.

Reason:

- The Sub Committee noted the representations of the parties and considered it to be logically sensible to avoid technical breaches during times of emergency.

Condition 3 to be as set out in the report, *applicable from 1 June 2012.*

Reason:

- The significant record of criminal and anti-social behaviour set out in full in the application. The evidence of police officers as to the layout of the premises and the difficulties of managing problems without CCTV were given particular weight.
- The express agreement of the parties to this condition was noted.
- The delay in implementation takes account of the practical requirements of completing the necessary works.

Condition 4 to be as set out in the report.

Reason:

- The representations of the parties and the Sub-Committee's awareness of youth drinking in the Redhill area and consideration of community and Council priorities.
- The express agreement of the parties to this condition was noted.

Condition 5 to be amended as follows:

Three SIA approved door supervisors to be on duty at all times on the premises during the following periods:

- (a) from 2000 hours until all customers have left the premises on any Friday or Saturday.*
- (b) such other dates as agreed with Surrey Police.*

For the sake of clarity, 'on duty' is intended to include only those persons working as a supervisor exclusively at that time, and not on a break or carrying out other duties.

Reason:

- The significant record of criminal and anti-social behaviour set out in full in the application.
- The clear evidence of poor historic door management.
- The move to a new provider of SIA approved door management.
- The physical changes to doors on the premises as outlined during the hearing.
- The evidence of police officers as to the need for three active SIA approved staff at all times to give reasonable supervision on the premises to effectively protect the public, in the light of the history of concerns as to handling of actual incidents which resulted in Court or police action in respect of activities on the premises, was given particular weight.

Condition 6 to be as set out in the report.

Reason:

- The significant record of criminal and anti-social behaviour set out in full in the application. The evidence of police officers as to the layout of the premises and the difficulties of understanding and managing problems without an incident log.

Condition 7 to be as set out in the report, *applicable from 1 June 2012.*

Reason:

- The significant evidence of antisocial behaviour and related noise on several dates, as set out in the application.
- This factual evidence as to the problems at the premises which was not opposed by the licence holder.
- The delay in implementation is to enable effective discussion and consultation with the licensing authority to maximise the benefit of the relevant signage.

Condition 8 to be as set out in the report, *applicable from 1 June 2012.*

Reason:

- Due to the clear and significant weight of unopposed evidence of a history of drug use on the premises.
- The express engagement of the DPS with crime reduction was noted.
- The delay in implementation is appropriate to enable effective discussion, advice and direction from Surrey Police on the most effective zero tolerance drug signage policy for these premises.

Condition 9 to be amended as follows:

When the premises are open for licensing activity all public toilets to be checked not less than twice per hour. A record of checks to be maintained and made available to any responsible authority requesting such record.

Reason:

- Due to the clear and significant weight of unopposed evidence of a history of drug use in the toilet area and the lack of historic effective management of those problems.
- Searches are considered to be most effective in reducing crime and anti social behaviour when they are randomised in timing but regularly carried out throughout an evening, based on representations of the parties and the opinion of the Sub-Committee.
- A log was considered appropriate to enable an evidence base for evaluating the performance of the management of the premises against this condition.

Condition 10 to be amended as follows:

SIA approved door supervisors, when employed at the premises, are to conduct searches of bags of customers seeking admission to the premises in order to deter and prevent illegal drugs from being brought onto the premises. In addition, as a condition of entry, those seeking entrance to the premises will be subject to a search of their person. This will be in accordance with the zero tolerance drug policy for the premises, a draft of which shall be supplied to Surrey Police within one month of the date of the hearing.

Reason:

- Due to the clear and significant weight of unopposed evidence of a history of drug use and anti-social behaviour which may well have been related to drug use on the premises.
- The express engagement of the DPS with future crime reduction measures was noted and given particular weight.

Condition 11 to be amended as follows:

There shall be no entry or re-entry to the premises after 0100 hours on Friday and Saturday with the exception of those patrons leaving the premises to smoke in the agreed smoking location.

Reason:

- The clear history of antisocial behaviour and related noise on several dates as set out in the application was considered.
- The representations of the license holder about the economic impact of a midnight re-entry ban was considered.
- The benefit to the community of a limitation on re-entry by reducing noise as set out by police officers was given particular weight.
- The change in DPS activity and door supervisor contractor, and his express willingness to work with the Police was given particular weight.
- The Sub-Committee considered that the line was closely argued but at this time considered that an earlier time of midnight would effectively prevent the economic activity of the premises and would be draconian in that it would effectively prevent the premises operating after 0100 hours.

Condition 12 to be as set out in the report.

Reason:

- Based upon the representations of both parties.

Additional Reasons for the Decision

1. The Sub Committee took into account the Council's own Statement of Licensing Policy, the Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under s.182 of the Licensing Act 2003, the individual merits of the case, Human Rights legislation and the rules of natural justice.
2. The Sub Committee considered that the review application, as granted with conditions, met the four licensing objectives.

Observations

The Sub-Committee noted the following undertakings made by Mr O'Mahoney, the Designated Premises Supervisor:

1. Mr O'Mahoney to control use of the side door of the premises leading onto Cromwell Road and to ensure that it is used for no other purpose than as a fire exit after 2000 hrs on any night.
2. Mr O'Mahoney to secure an SIA badge by 1 June 2012.
3. From 3 April 2012 Mr O'Mahoney will cease to be a DPS at any other premises and will advise the licensing authority should he become a DPS at any other premises in the future.

2. A CCTV system must be installed on the premises to the standards required by Surrey Police. The system is to be fully maintained at all times with monthly maintenance checks being undertaken and operational at all times when the premises are open and undertaking licensable activities. The system must cover all internal public areas and immediate exterior of the premises aimed at preventing crime and disorder. At least one camera shall provide clear images of people entering and leaving the premises. All staff must be fully trained in the operation of the system and a record kept of this training including a record of system maintenance retained on the premises for inspection by any responsible authority on request. There must always be a member of staff on the premises able to operate the system when the premises are open and carrying out any licensable activity. All CCTV footage to be retained for a minimum of 31 days and made available either for viewing or in a format that can be downloaded within 24 hours of any request being made by a Police officer or authorised person. 

I am a Police Licensing Officer for Surrey Police covering the borough of Reigate & Banstead. On Friday 30th March 2012, I was present at a Licensing Authority Sub committee review hearing concerning The Dog and Duck Public house, 33 High Street, Redhill, Surrey. RH1 1RD. As a result of this review hearing several new conditions were added to the premises licence, in addition three undertakings were also made by the Designated premises Supervisor Mr Owen O'Mahoney, these are not shown on the premises licence but are shown on the notice of determination. The Notice of determination is dated 4th April, therefore conditions came into affect on 25th April except those that specified a start date of 1st June. On Wednesday 23rd May I visited the premises and spoke to Mr O'Mahoney in relation to a visit by uniformed officers on 19th May, Mr O'Mahoney confirmed he had not been on the premises at the time of the visit, stating he had just popped out, I reminded him that it was a condition of the licence that a personal licence holder is on the premises on Friday and Saturday evenings. I again visited the premises at 2100hrs on Friday 6th July and spoke to Mr O'Mahoney I requested a copy of his drug policy and he stated he would e-mail a copy. At 2015hrs on Friday 13th July as part of a multi agency visit, I visited the premises in company with Pc 40024 Stevens From The Surrey Police Alcohol Enforcement team, Liz Holliday Licensing officer from Reigate and Banstead Borough Council, Kate Bailey from Surrey Trading standards and three uniform officers. As we approached the premises a male who I recognised as one of the door staff was just putting on the armband containing his SIA badge, as we arrived a second male who I also recognised came out of the premises also putting on his arm band. Pc Stevens spoke to both men and asked to see their SIA badges, these were handed to Pc Stevens who passed them to me and I confirmed that the details as being door staff whose details I had taken on a previous visit. We then entered the premises, Liz Holliday and Pc Stevens spoke to the DPS Owen O'Mahoney. During the visit I checked the Gents toilets to the rear of the premises and could find no notices in relation to drug use. There were no signs at either door asking patrons to leave quietly, and I could see no signs in relation to proof of age policy. I also noted that the single door at the rear of the premises leading out on to Cromwell Road was fitted with a large bolt at the top but was not bolted and I was able to open the door. I spoke to Mr O'Mahoney and pointed out that he had made an undertaking that the back door would be secured and used only as a fire exit from 8pm. He stated that was one of the door staffs responsibilities, but due to all the Police being around they had probably forgotten. I also asked him to confirm his SIA Status, he stated that he had taken the course but had not yet received his badge. Pc Stevens asked Mr O'Mahoney to produce his Incident log after approximately 15 minutes of searching the bar area and

going upstairs he produced what appeared to be a 2012 diary with details of future pub watch meetings. We left the premises at 2108hrs. We were therefore on the premises from 2015hrs to 2108hrs during which time a third member of door staff did not attend the premises, the two that were on duty remained outside the front door and on a couple of occasions stepped inside and spoke to the DJ who was setting up his equipment. They did not visit the toilet area or make any checks of persons seated at the rear of the premises. 2. A CCTV system must be installed on the premises to the standards required by Surrey Police. The system is to be fully maintained at all times with monthly maintenance checks being undertaken and operational at all times when the premises are open and undertaking licensable activities. At least one camera shall provide clear images of people entering and leaving the premises. A refusals log is to be maintained and made available to any responsible authority upon request.
4. Three SIA approved door supervisors to be on duty at all times on the premises during the following periods:
 - a. From 2000 hours until all customers have left the premises on any Friday or Saturday
 - b. Such other dates as agreed with Surrey Police.
5. An incident log shall be kept at the premises. A record of all incidents relating to crime and disorder and anti-social behaviour shall be logged showing the date and time of the incident, details of the nature of the incident and the individual(s) involved and the name of the member of staff involved. The log shall be kept up to date and on the premises at all times and made available for inspection on request by officers of the Licensing Authority and/or Police.
6. At each exit located at the premises, signs shall be erected which are easily visible to customers and which request customers to leave quietly. The size, lettering, wording and location of such signs shall be agreed in writing with the Licensing Authority by 1 June 2012.
7. The premises licence holder shall implement a zero tolerance drug policy that includes signs placed visibly at all entrances to the premises and visibly in both the male and female toilets. The signs shall indicate that no illegal drugs are allowed on the premises and that anyone being found in possession of such drugs will be ejected from the premises. The zero tolerance drug policy to be agreed with Surrey Police by 1 June 2012.
8. When the premises is open for licensable activity, all public toilets to be checked not less than twice per hour. A record of these checks to be maintained and made available to any responsible authority requesting such record.

9. SIA approved door supervisors, when employed at the premises, are to conduct searches of bags of customers seeking admission to the premises in order to deter and prevent illegal drugs from being brought onto the premises. In addition, as a condition of entry, those seeking entrance to the premises will be subject to a search of their person. This will be in accordance with the zero tolerance drug policy for the premises, a draft of which shall be supplied to Surrey Police within one month of the date of the hearing.
10. There shall be no entry or re-entry to the premises after 0100 hours on Friday and Saturday with the exception of those patrons leaving the premises to smoke in the agreed smoking area.
11. Plans are to be provided to the Licensing Authority by the premises Licence holder indicating a marked smoking area within one month of the date of this hearing. Once this defined smoking area has been approved by the responsible authorities, this area is to be controlled by at least one SIA approved Door Supervisor when employed at the premises when it is being used by any person. No customers shall be permitted to exit or enter the premises or the approved smoking area at any time carrying drinking glasses or glass bottles.

Prior to attending the Dog and Duck Public House I was contacted by PS 3448 SMITH who informed me that he had been monitoring the entrance to the premises on CCTV and that there were no SIA Door Staff present at 2000 hours. As we approached the premises, PS 3448 SMITH stated that two black males both wearing dark clothing appeared at the entrance. They appeared to be door supervisors but were not displaying any SIA accreditation as is required under Section 9 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001. On my arrival at the premises at 2015 hours I spoke to both these males who confirmed that they were SIA Registered Door staff and both presented to me their accreditation. I gave them a verbal warning in relation to failing to correctly display their SIA accreditation whilst on duty. One of the door staff also confirmed that they were the only two SIA door staff on duty but a third SIA door supervisor was due to arrive at 2100 hours. My colleague Licensing Officer HUME had recorded the details of these two SIA Door Supervisors.

I then spoke with a male who I know to be Owen MAHONEY. He confirmed with me that he was the Designated Premises Supervisor as well as the Premises License Holder. I pointed out to him the requirement as Per Condition 4, Annex 3 of his Premises License to have three SIA Door Supervisors on duty from 2000 hours and therefore he was in breach of his Premises License and as such an offence contrary to Section 136 Licensing Act 2003 had been committed. I then cautioned MAHONEY at 2023 hours advising him that he was not under arrest and free to leave. I also advised him of his legal rights and he indicated that he did not wish to speak with a solicitor and was happy to answer my questions without legal representation. MAHONEY then stated to me that he was acting as the third SIA Door Supervisor as well as working behind the bar. I asked to see his SIA accreditation (License) as he was not displaying any on his person. He informed me that he had not yet received his license from the SIA but had completed the training to obtain such a License. I explained to him that he was not able to fulfil both functions of being a SIA Door Supervisor and managing the premises and or working behind the bar at the same time. Both are distinct roles. MAHONEY responded by stating that it was his understanding following the Review Hearing in March 2012 that he was able to do this. I reminded him

that I was at the Review Hearing and it was made very clear to him at that time that he could not undertake both roles at the same time and that he indicated to the Sub-Committee his understanding of this. I further explained that in any event he was unable to undertake the role of SIA Door Supervisor as he had yet to receive his SIA License. I then asked him to produce both his Personal License and either the original of the Premises License or a certified copy of it. MAHONEY produced both as requested. I noticed that the address shown on his Personal License was recorded as 12 SELWOOD ROAD, SUTTON, SM3 8JU. I asked MAHONEY if this was his current address. He replied that he had moved three months ago to the premises above DOG and DOG, 33 HIGH STREET, REDHILL. I pointed out to him that it was an offence contrary to Section 127 Licensing Act 2003 to fail to notify the Licensing Authority of a change of address. I then noticed that Part B of the Summary Premises License was not correctly displayed as is required under Section 57 Licensing Act 2003. Only page 1 of 3 was on display. I pointed this out to MAHONEY who did not appear concerned that he was not complying with the requirements expected of him under the Licensing Act 2003.

I then went through each of the conditions outlined in Annex 3 of the Premises License with MAHONEY. The following breaches were identified:

Condition 3: No evidence of an Age Verification Policy was produced. No signs on display at the premises indicating a challenge 25 policy. MAHONEY stated that his staff had been trained with regards to challenging identification but was not able to support this with any evidence.

Condition 4: Only two SIA Door Staff were on duty at 2015 hours, the time of police arrival at the premises. At 2108 hours, when I left the premises with my colleagues there was still only two SIA Door Staff on duty despite being told earlier that a third SIA door supervisor would arrive at 2100 hours.

Condition 6: There were no signs erected at each exit requesting customers to leave quietly.

Condition 7: There was no evidence that the Premises License Holder had implemented a Zero Tolerance Drug Policy. No attempt has been made by the Premises License Holder to agree such a policy with Surrey Police by 1st June 2012. There are no signs placed visibly at all entrances of the premises or visibly in both the male and female toilets which indicate that no illegal drugs are allowed on the premises and that anyone being found in possession of such drugs will be ejected from the premises.

Condition 8: A record of toilet checks could not be produced and there was no evidence supplied that any such checks were being carried out.

Condition 9: During the time that police were at the premises, from 2015 hours until approximately 2108 hours, not once did any of the SIA Door supervisors search any bags of customers seeking admission to the premises. Nor were anyone challenged for identification. In addition, no search of person was observed at any time.

Condition 11: MAHONEY was not able to confirm whether plans had been provided to the Licensing Authority indicating a marked smoking area. In fact MAHONEY stated that they do not have a smoking area at the premises which seemed to contradict the evidence to the contrary given that there was a roped

off area outside the entrance where customers were seen to be smoking in full view of both myself and other police officers.

With regards to the conditions outlined in Annex 2 of the Premises License, the following breaches were identified:

Condition 3: None of the SIA Door Staff on duty at the time of police arrival to the premises were displaying their SIA Licenses.

No prominent, clear and legible notices were displayed at all exits requesting the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.

I advised MAHONEY that given the number of breaches to his Premises License, contrary to Section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003, together with the fact that he had failed to notify the Licensing Authority of his change of address contrary to Section 127 Licensing Act 2003 and that his Summary Part B of the Premises License was incorrectly displayed contrary to Section 57 Licensing Act 2003 consideration would be given to prosecuting him for these offences and also that the premises could be subject to further review by the Licensing Authority.

MAHONEY responded "WELL YOU MIGHT AS WELL CLOSE ME DOWN THEN".

Throughout my entire visit, MAHONEY displayed a very belligerent attitude towards his responsibilities as both a Premises License Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor. He did not seem to care whether or not he was complying with his legal requirements under the Licensing Act 2003. In fact, I felt that our presence was an imposition on him. I have serious concerns as to MAHONEY's ability to be an effective Designated Premises Supervisor let alone being the Premises License Holder for a busy town centre Licensed Premises. Given the fact that this premises was only reviewed by the Licensing Sub-Committee of Reigate and Banstead Borough Council in March 2012, nearly all of the conditions placed on the Premises License by this Sub-Committee have been blatantly ignored, I believe that serious consideration should be given for revocation of the Premises License.

At 2108 hours I resumed from the premises having made it perfectly clear to MAHONEY my intentions with regards to either prosecution or taking the Premises to another Licensing Review.

1. I am a Licensing Officer for Reigate & Banstead Borough Council, I have been in my current position for five years and, and I have worked for Reigate & Banstead Borough Council for 12 years. I hold a Certificate of Higher Education in Licensing Law Practice (Distinction) from The University of Westminster. I am also a member of The Institute of Licensing. As an officer, my duties include processing applications and undertaking enforcement relating to the Licensing Act 2003.
2. On Friday the 13th July 2012 I took part in a Joint action day with Surrey Police and Surrey Trading Standards to visit pubs, restaurants and off licences in the Redhill area. At approximately 20.15 hours, we visited the Dog and Duck Public House, 33 High Street, Redhill, Surrey, RH1 1RD. I approached the front entrance to the pub located on The High Street with Pete Stevens (PC40024) from the Police Alcohol Enforcement team, Murrae Hume Licensing Officer for Surrey Police and Kate Bailey from Surrey Trading Standards and I clearly saw that there was only one man on duty outside as a door supervisor. While Pete Stevens, talked to this door supervisor another door supervisor came out of the pub and joined him. They both showed their Identity badges to Pete Stevens. They did not have their badges displayed on their arms at this time. They put them on following a request from Pete Stevens to do so and a reminder that they should always be on while working.

3. Pete Stevens, Murrae Hume, Kate Bailey and I, then entered the pub and spoke to the premises Licence holder and Designated Premises Supervisor, Mr Owen Mahoney. Pete Stevens explained the condition that there should be 3 door supervisors on duty from 20.00 hours. Mr Mahoney said he was also a door supervisor. Pete Stevens explained to Mahoney and that he could not be working behind the bar and acting a door supervisor. Mr Mahoney said that he had misinterpreted the licence conditions and thought that he could. Pete Stevens then explained that he had breached a condition of his licence and cautioned Mr Mahoney. Mr Mahoney told us that he did not have a door supervisor badge yet. I asked Mr Mahoney if he had completed his S.I.A. (Security Industry Authority) Training, he said he had but had not received his badge, he guessed this was because the S.I.A. was busy with the Olympics. Mr Mahoney then showed PC 40024 his personnel licence. Pete Stevens told Mr Mahoney that it was not in his current address and that this was also an offence.

4. While Pete Stevens wrote up his notes, I asked Mr Mahoney some questions on a check list prepared for the joint enforcement day (EH01). The questions I asked related to the Mandatory Conditions attached to his premises licence for The Dog and Duck. I asked Mr Mahoney if he was the Designated Premises Supervisor and he said he was and that he lived and worked in the pub most days. I asked him if, as a personal licence holder, he authorised the sale of alcohol by all of his staff. He said that this was done verbally but that there was no written authorisation.

5. I asked Mr Mahoney if any irresponsible alcohol promotions took place in the pub or if any alcohol was dispensed directly into the mouth, he said no. I asked Mr Mahoney if he supplied free tap water he said yes.

6. I asked Mr Mahoney if he had an age verification policy in place. Mr Mahoney said that the staff had all been trained and knew what to ask for, but he was a bit vague about the exact details, he could not supply a written Age Verification Policy. I explained to Mr Mahoney that as the personal licence holder who authorises the sale of alcohol, he needs to be sure that the staff selling alcohol have had the relevant training, he said he was aware of this. I asked Mr Mahoney if he had an example of the training that staff had done on age verification anywhere. Mr Mahoney said that all staff training was undertaken with a lady called Ginny and therefore he could not lay his hands on it. I asked Mr Mahoney if Ginny was a personal licence holder and he replied no.
7. I asked Mr Mahoney if he had smaller measures available and if customers were made aware of the availability of these measures. Mr Mahoney said they were available and marked on the glasses, but their availability was not displayed anywhere. Kate Bailey from Surrey Trading Standards then said that she had discussed this with Mr Mahoney and would give him a notice about not displaying the availability of smaller measures.
8. On the wall by the bar the first page of part B of the premises licence was displayed (see EH02), I explained to Mr Mahoney that Part B of the licence should be displayed in full but that only page 1 of 3 were in fact displayed. Mr Mahoney said that the Marston's don't like signs up everywhere, but that he realised that he did need to put it up in full. There was no sign to say where the full licence was kept, but Mr Mahoney was able to supply the full licence from a file.



displaying an ID on his arm. A second door security man arrived a few minutes later. PC STEVENS advised the door security men that there should be 3 door staff on and they must all wear their ID at all times. He advised them that CCTV had observed only 1 door security staff at the door, and that he had not been displaying his ID. PC STEVENS took a note of the door staff ID details. Once inside the premises I advised the man, who I was later informed was Mr Owen MAHONEY the person in charge, that I was going to go behind the bar and carry out checks on their drinks, and check for relevant notices. Mr MAHONEY said this was OK. I walked around the bar, and observed that the only price list on display was an A4 list of Cocktails displayed in the middle of the bar. To the left of the bar, on a window sill were four menu stands which had a wine list and Pitchers and bar snacks in each of them. These were not out on display for customers to clearly see, and appeared to have been placed there out of the way. The wine list did include an indication of the quantity wine by the glass was available in, but this price list was not clearly displayed for customers. Under the Consumer Protection from Unfair Consumer Trading Regulations it is an offence to omit information which the average consumer needs to take an informed decision regarding a purchase, and this would include a price indication. I saw that there was no Weights and Measures Indications displayed to show the quantity that gin, rum, vodka and whisky were sold by, as required by the Intoxicating Liquor Regulations 1988, in that a notice of quantities should be readily available for inspection without asking. Additionally there was no indication as to the ownership details for The Dog and Duck, as required by the

Companies Act 2006. I advised Mr MAHONEY that prices were required to be displayed for a range of drinks to ensure his customers were not misled either by an omission to display prices, or by displaying misleading information as to the price they would have to pay. I also advised Mr MAHONEY that a Weights and Measures indication was required to be displayed to indicate the quantity gin, rum, vodka and whisky were sold by. Mr MAHONEY informed me that a price list was being produced, and this included the required Weights and Measures indications for wine sold by the glass, and would be on display next week. On this disc several persons are seen entering the premises none of which appear to be subject to any search procedure. The only persons entering with bags have their bags checked; however this is immediately after uniform officers have entered the premises.
On the 20th and 21st July tables and chairs have been removed so there is no drinking in the external smoking area. Several persons are seen entering the premises none of which appear to be subject to any physical search procedure, some bag searches are carried out, but not everyone entering with a bag is searched.



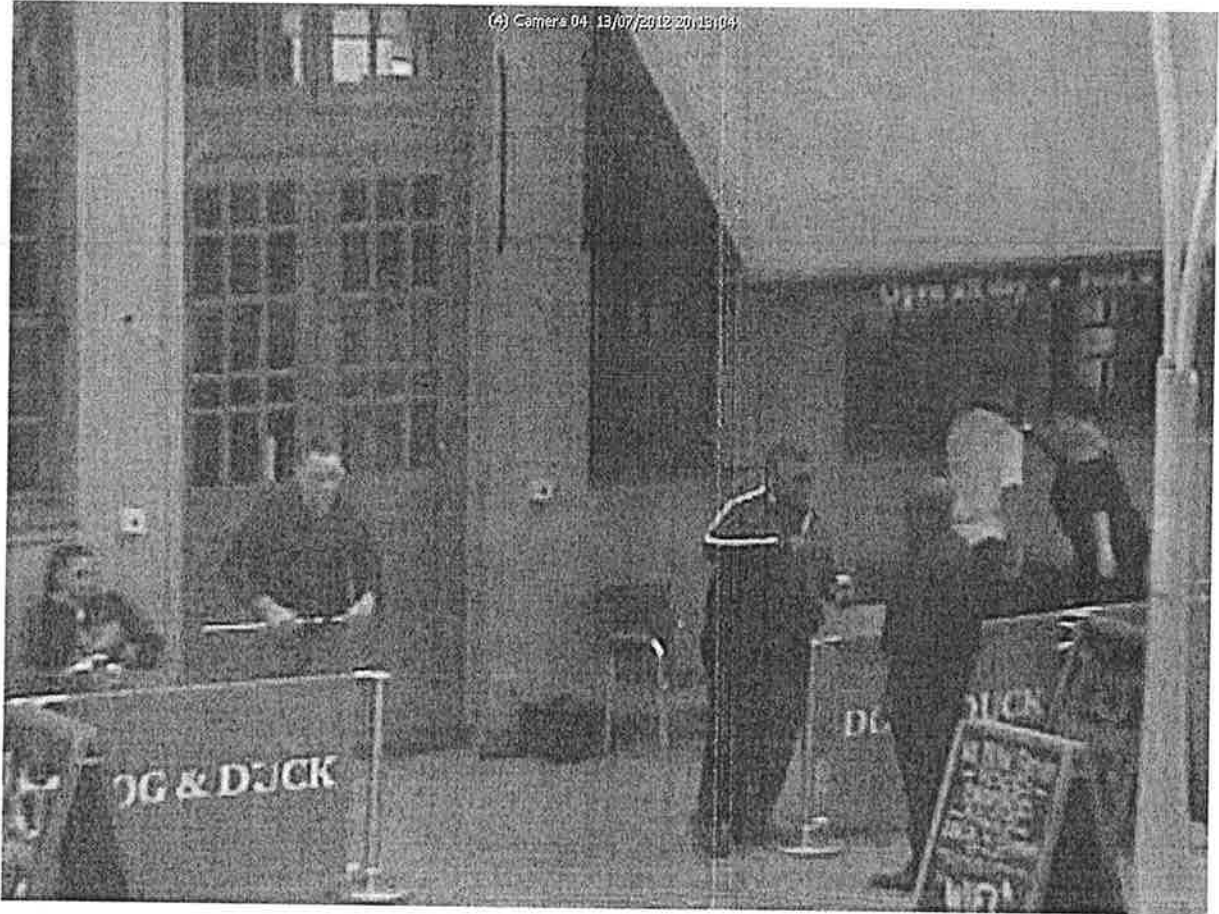

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1 Premises Licence, Sale of Alcohol permitted

"No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence

- a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of it or,
- b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended"

"Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence."

2 1.-(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

4.-(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

I have undertaken my own risk assessment to take the following proposed steps.

The types of regulated entertainment proposed materially do no more than reinstate the normal pub entertainment that was previously unregulated in B1 above.

No new steps have been identified in relation to the four licensing objectives save as below.

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

1. Any person exercising a security activity (as defined by paragraph 2 (1) (a) of schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001) shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
2. See Annex 3, condition 4
3. Any person as defined in condition (1) will clearly display his name badge at all times whilst on duty.
4. No customers apparently carrying open bottles upon entry shall be admitted to the premises at any time the premises are open to the public. See Annex 3, condition 1
5. See Annex 3, Condition 2
6. Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area provided for that purpose. See Annex 3, Condition 11

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

1. To comply with the reasonable requirements of the fire officer from time to time.
2. To comply with the reasonable requirements of the building control officer.

No further risks have been identified which need to be addressed, save as below

1. Where appropriate, prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
2. Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.

The restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 will apply. No unusual or additional risks of harm to children have been identified.

Children under the age of 16 shall not be permitted to enter the premises

Embedded Restrictions

1 Premises Licence, Door Supervisors

Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority may be used at the premises to guard against:-

- a. unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision), or
- b. outbreaks of disorder, or
- c. damage

NB This condition will only be imposed where the premises licence contains a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at premises to carry out the activities specified in the above condition. The condition is not mandatory in respect of premises:-

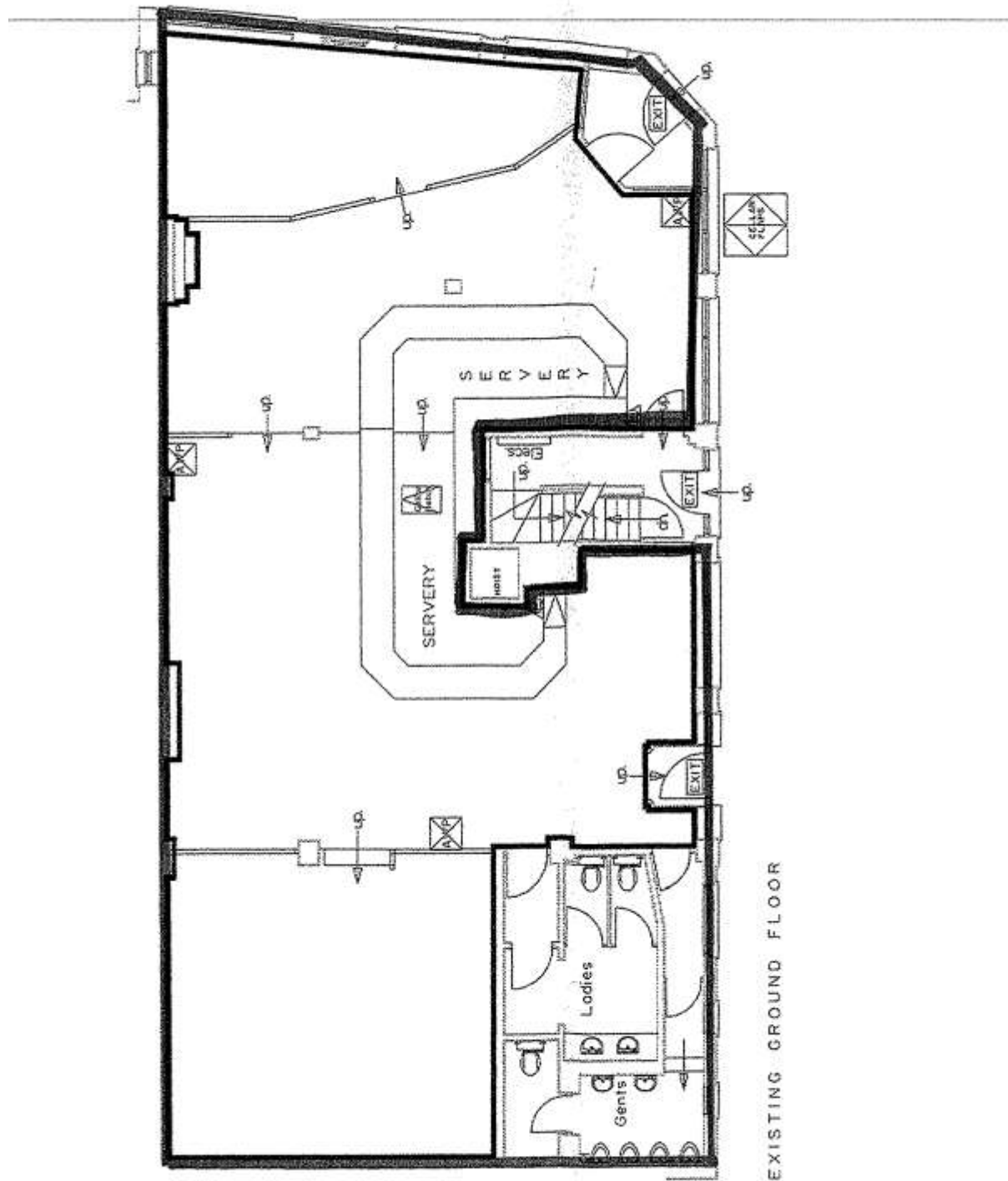
- * with premises licences authorising the performance of plays or films
- * being used exclusively by a club with a club premises certificate
- * under a TEN authorising plays or films
- * under a gaming licence .(but see Licensing Act S21(2)(b))
- * being used for an occasion prescribed by regulations under the SIA.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

1. Save in an emergency a personal licence holder must be on the premises on Friday and Saturday nights from 1800 hours to closing when licensable activity is taking place or when there are organised events taking place.
2. A CCTV system must be installed on the premises to the standards required by Surrey Police. The system is to be fully maintained at all times with monthly maintenance checks being undertaken and operational at all times when the premises are open and undertaking licensable activities. The system must cover all internal public areas and immediate exterior of the premises aimed at preventing crime and disorder. At least one camera shall provide clear images of people entering and leaving the premises. All staff must be fully trained in the operation of the system and a record kept of this training including a record of system maintenance retained on the premises for inspection by any responsible authority on request. There must always be a member of staff on the premises able to operate the system when the premises are open and carrying out any licensable activity. All CCTV footage to be retained for a minimum of 31 days and made available either for viewing or in a format that can be downloaded within 24 hours of any request being made by a Police officer or authorised person. Applicable from 1 June 2012.
3. The age verification policy required by the mandatory conditions shall specify the age of 25 instead of 18 so as to require that any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall be asked to provide proof of age in the required format when seeking admission to the premises and before being sold or served alcohol. A refusals log is to be maintained and made available to any responsible authority upon request.
4. Three SIA approved door supervisors to be on duty at all times on the premises during the following periods:
 - a. From 2000 hours until all customers have left the premises on any Friday or Saturday
 - b. Such other dates as agreed with Surrey Police.

5. An incident log shall be kept at the premises. A record of all incidents relating to crime and disorder and anti-social behaviour shall be logged showing the date and time of the incident, details of the nature of the incident and the individual(s) involved and the name of the member of staff involved. The log shall be kept up to date and on the premises at all times and made available for inspection on request by officers of the Licensing Authority and/or Police.
6. At each exit located at the premises, signs shall be erected which are easily visible to customers and which request customers to leave quietly. The size, lettering, wording and location of such signs shall be agreed in writing with the Licensing Authority by 1 June 2012.
7. The premises licence holder shall implement a zero tolerance drug policy that includes signs placed visibly at all entrances to the premises and visibly in both the male and female toilets. The signs shall indicate that no illegal drugs are allowed on the premises and that anyone being found in possession of such drugs will be ejected from the premises. The zero tolerance drug policy to be agreed with Surrey Police by 1 June 2012.
8. When the premises is open for licensable activity, all public toilets to be checked not less than twice per hour. A record of these checks to be maintained and made available to any responsible authority requesting such record.
9. SIA approved door supervisors, when employed at the premises, are to conduct searches of bags of customers seeking admission to the premises in order to deter and prevent illegal drugs from being brought onto the premises. In addition, as a condition of entry, those seeking entrance to the premises will be subject to a search of their person. This will be in accordance with the zero tolerance drug policy for the premises, a draft of which shall be supplied to Surrey Police within one month of the date of the hearing.
10. There shall be no entry or re-entry to the premises after 0100 hours on Friday and Saturday with the exception of those patrons leaving the premises to smoke in the agreed smoking area.
11. Plans are to be provided to the Licensing Authority by the premises Licence holder indicating a marked smoking area within one month of the date of this hearing. Once this defined smoking area has been approved by the responsible authorities, this area is to be controlled by at least one SIA approved Door Supervisor when employed at the premises when it is being used by any person. No customers shall be permitted to exit or enter the premises or the approved smoking area at any time carrying drinking glasses or glass bottles.

Dear Sir,

I write to voice my concern over Surrey Police's decision to seek the revocation of the licence for The Dog and Duck Public House, High Street, Redhill. I believe there was a review undertaken in March of this year, after an increase in calls to police to the establishment.

The conditions of the review undertaken, apart from the removal of the then Bar Manager and installation of CCTV, were largely of a procedural and bureaucratic nature. Surrey Police obviously felt that putting various signs around the bar and toilets would act as a deterrent for illegal activities, I am not convinced this would have any effect at all.

What has made a significant change to the running of the establishment has been the change in the personnel and the inclusion of CCTV. As a regular customer of The Dog and Duck I have found Mr. Mahoney and the rest of the staff to be courteous and competent, who are nevertheless capable of nipping any trouble in the bud. The patrons that had been responsible for the overwhelming majority of the anti-social behaviour have now been excluded and therefore recourse to having to call out Surrey Police has dropped dramatically. Had the corrective actions implemented by Mr. Mahoney not been effective Surrey Police might have had ground for revocation, but the grounds stated seem of a largely petty, trivial and bureaucratic nature, which could be construed as a 'witch hunt' by members of Surrey Police. The witness statement given by PC Stevens seems to bear this out, as his statement and actions seem both confrontational and arrogant.

There have been persistent rumours of re-development of the area around Cromwell Road and I have a major concern that revocation of the licence for The Dog and Duck would lead to the building becoming derelict, which would be very convenient for the planners and this leads me to question whether this application is part of a hidden agenda regarding the re-development of the area.

As I have said I have been a regular customer in the Dog and Duck for several years and have seen a number of Licensees and Bar Managers come and go, some have been excellent, some not so good. In my opinion Mr. Mahoney is one of the best managers the Dog and Duck has had.

The pub over the years has exhibited an eclectic mix of customers, which I believe is helpful in building a community spirit and it would be more than unfortunate if this was lost. Further the Dog and Duck has exhibited an inclusive policy with regards to customers with disabilities, not only from the bar staff, but from the regular customers as well. Over the years many charity events have taken place in the pub making significant contributions for various charities. This I hope is evidence for the benefit the Dog and Duck has given to the community at large.

In conclusion I believe the action taken by Surrey Police in this instance is not justified and therefore would like to see the application for revocation of the license for The Dog and Duck, High Street, Redhill rejected.



I am writing this letter because I am very concerned that the Surrey Police in conjunction with the Surrey Mirror appear to be carrying out a vendetta against the public house the Dog & Duck in Redhill.

Before the licencing review on the 30th of March 2012 the Surrey Mirror ran a front page article about the Dog & Duck. The article used information presumably supplied by the Surrey Police. On reading this it became apparent that the complaints had been sensationalised and were misleading. Quote, "*The Dog & Duck in Redhill High Street had 36 incidents which needed police attendance*". They highlight;

6 drugs related incidents

6 antisocial behaviour

6 accusations of assault

7 public order offences

7 other miscellaneous incidents

Which when I went to school added up to 32. The missing incidents are presumably so banal that they are not even included under miscellaneous. Equally they state; "*Following call outs which date from July 1st 2011*". The Dog & Duck didn't open until the 7th of July following a refurbishment. One wonders how this would hold up in court. Again a quote; "*The call outs included allegations of assault, some of which involved door staff*". Yes one of the door staff was arrested and released with no charges. So why was the allegation mentioned? Could this

be classed as misinformation? Which begs the question; how many of these call outs have resulted in a prosecution?

The resulting review caused the landlord Owen Mahoney to accept 11 conditions and 3 undertakings. Now it appears that the Dog & Duck is once more in dire straits. The police or perhaps inspector Haycock seeks to revoke the premises licence. The grounds of the revocation are; 8 conditions and 2 undertakings are being breached. Whilst this does appear totally unacceptable if one looks at each fault individually they are mostly minor oversights. The fact that only two door staff were on duty seems damning. However Mr O'Mahoney had done the SIA Course and passed but had not received the badge. This is an error of judgement and or knowledge of the fine print of the SIA rules.

All these issues have now been undertaken. I do feel that a friendly visit from the licencing officer to advise on any breaches or omissions would have been more productive. If Mr Mahoney had help and advice these problems could have been resolved thereby saving the Surrey Police, Local Council and Weights and Measures a considerable amount of time and expense. Equally at the review of March the 30th much was made of the amount of callouts over a period of months. However the police have made no mention of call outs on the Notice of Application. As these were the grounds for the review in March and they no longer appear a problem. Does this not suggest that Mr Mahoney has "got his house in order"? Despite making a few mistakes.

I would like to add that Mr O' Mahoney is a courteous and affable man. He runs a clean and friendly pub. It would be a crying shame that now all the issues have been resolved, his licence was to be revoked.
