# Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

## Indoor Sporting Events

Traditional Pub Games e.g. Darts and Pool.

Recorded Music

This may include karaoke.

### Entertainment of a similar desc & Other Entertainment falling within Act

This shall be limited to comperes for quizzes, disc jockeys and similar events using voice amplification.

### Supply of Alcohol

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition, permitted hours means: Monday to Thursday 8:30 a.m. to 12 midnight

Friday 8:30 a.m. to 1.00 a.m. the following day Saturday 08:30 to 1.00 a.m. the following day Sunday 09:00 a.m. to 11.00 p.m.

#### Non-standard timings

On New Year's Eve all licenced activities and the Hours the Premises are Open to the Public shall be authorised from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day.

On Sundays immediately prior to Bank Holidays all licenced activities and the Hours the Premises are Open to the Public shall have a finish time of 12 midnight.

General

The licensee will comply with the Terms, Conditions and Regulations prescribed by Reigate and Banstead Borough Council, 1 November 2004.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

1. Notices shall be displayed at the premises which warn customers to be aware of pickpockets or bag snatchers and to guard their property.

2. Notices shall be displayed to advise customers not to leave bags unattended.

3. The premises licence holder shall continue to develop its security procedures in conjunction with the police.

4. For customers paying by credit card, an itemised bill shall be provided.

5. All amusement and cigarette vending machines shall be kept in view of the bar servery.

#### Public Safety

1. Notices detailing the actions to be taken in the event of fire or other emergencies, including how the Fire brigade should be summoned, shall be prominently displayed and protected from damage and deterioration.

2. In the absence of adequate daylight, the lighting in any area accessible to the public, members or guests, shall be fully in operation when they are present.

3. Fire safety signs shall be adequately illuminated.

4. Emergency lighting shall not be altered without the consent of the relevant fire officer.



### The Prevention of Public Nuisance

1. The premises licence holder shall ensure that noise or vibration does not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.

2. Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.

3. Noxious smells from the licensed premises shall not be permitted so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties and the premises shall be properly vented.

4. The windows at first floor level shall be kept closed after 23.00 hours.

#### The Protection of Children from Harm

All staff shall be trained to request evidence of age from any person seeking to buy alcohol and appearing to the member of staff to be under the age of eighteen. Such evidence is to be of a photographic nature, such as a passport or photographic driving licence, until other effective identification technology, such as thumbprint or pupil recognition, is introduced.

# **Embedded Restrictions**

Entertainment

The appropriate sections of the Regulations and Conditions for Entertainment Licences dated August 1996 issued by Reigate and Banstead Borough Council apply.

The following special conditions also must be adhered to:-

A. The number of persons to be admitted (excluding staff) shall not exceed 119 persons on the Ground Floor and 195 persons on the First Floor.

#### Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- The Licensee shall ensure that any music provided at the premises shall not cause a disturbance to local residents. At all times any music shall be inaudible in any residential property, the test of which is that it shall be no more than barely audible at the boundary of any residential property.
- 2) No use of outdoor areas by patrons after 2300 hours, except for ingress to and egress from the premises. No exit via the rear garden after 2300 hours except for emergency.
- 3) External lighting to be kept to a minimum compatible with safety purposes after 2300 hours.
- 4) No music or amplified sound outside the premises at any time.
