SUBJECT:	APPLICATION FOR RENEWAL AND VARIATION OF PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE		
PURPOSE OF THE REPORT:	TO DETERMINE THE APPLICATION FOR EXTENDED HOURS FOR THE RENEWAL OF THE PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENCE FOR COLOURS SPORTS CLUB AND BAR, QUEENSWAY, REDHILL		

RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Committee is recommended to determine the application.

Background

- 1. An application has been received from Mr C Scott for renewal of the public entertainment licence (Music & Dancing) for Colours Sports Club and Bar and for an extension of the licensing hours.
- 2. Colours has been licensed for public entertainment since 1 November 1997.
- 3. Currently the premises is licensed for public entertainment from midday-midnight, seven days a week. The application is for a one-hour extension on Fridays and Saturdays until 1.00am the following morning.
- 4. The following conditions are placed on the current public entertainment licence:
 - The maximum occupancy shall be 300 persons.
 - The number of guests to be allowed entry after 11pm shall be limited to one guest per member.
 - All drinking glasses used at the premises to be made of toughened glass.

Factors for Consideration

- 5. Surrey Police and Surrey Fire & Rescue Service have confirmed that they have no objections to the application.
- 6. The notice of application has been displayed at the premises for the statutory period and no objections have been received from members of the public.

7. The applicant has been invited to attend the Committee meeting and has been advised that he may attend with legal or other representation.

Options

- 8. The Licensing & Regulatory Committee may:
 - Refuse the application;
 - Grant the application with or without additional conditions to the general conditions imposed by the Council's Regulations and Conditions.

Appeal Procedure

- 9. The following persons may appeal to the Magistrates' Court at any time before the expiration of the period of 21 days beginning with the relevant date, i.e. the date on which the applicant receives written notification of the Council's decision:
 - An applicant for the variation of the terms, conditions or restrictions subject to which an entertainments licence in respect of any place is held, whose application is refused.
 - A holder of any such licence who is aggrieved by any term, condition or restriction on or subject to which the licence is held.
