I am concerned that by granting another licence to the Prince of Wales, it will only continue to go towards degrading this residential part of Reigate.


The noise of the bands that play there is very loud, and whilst I shut my windows to block out the sound, I can still hear it, even with the TV turned up.

I have watched youths leaving the pub, screaming and shaking at the top of their voices, vandalising the telephone boxes near the station and being involved in brawls in the street.

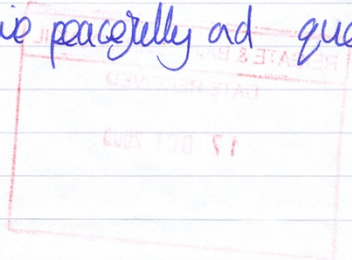
Please can I ask that you consider the above information when making your decision and to return to the streets and

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am writing with regards to the licence renewal application made by the Prince of Wales pub, Holmesdale Road, Reigate. This pub regularly has loud music, blasting out until gone 11pm - Tuesday nights are especially bad. I find it staggering that such a place in such close proximity to residential buildings can be allowed to get away with this - especially on weeknights when people have to get up for work. The 'music' is not even 'music' just noise - even I, being only 25 years old, find it almost unbearable some nights - especially in the summer months when I was prevented from ever opening a window.

Besides the ghastly noise levels the pub attracts hooligans who constantly scream and drop litter (I have ever seen such choice individuals urinating on the station steps on a number of occasions - not pleasant when I have to use it every day).

I have phoned the environmental health services up a few months ago to complain but no further action has been taken.

I hope you take this complaint seriously and the number of others I hope you will receive as I know that many other residents of Warmer Court find

the noise levels unbearable - especially those with young children. At the very least this pub should not be allowed to have 'live music' on weeknights.

Thank you in advance for your help on this matter.

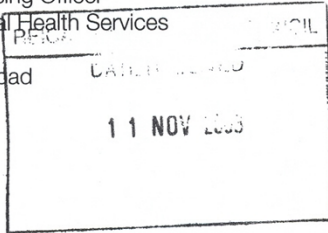

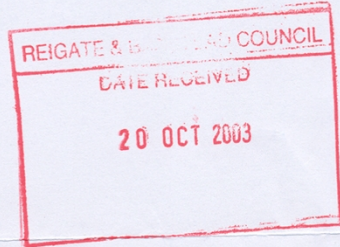

**Prince of Wales Pub (2 Holmesdale Rd, Reigate, Surrey, RH2 0BQ)
Licence renewal application**

I object to the renewal of the 'Music & Dancing' Licence for the Prince of Wales pub.

The pub is located opposite my flat and despite the fact that all the windows in the flat are double glazed, I regularly suffer from the level of noise caused by the pub's loud music.

- The pub runs between one to five live music nights every week.
- The music is so loud that I have to turn up the volume of the Television or Stereo to be able to hear it over the pub's music.
- It is impossible to read, study or concentrate on anything I am doing.
- The situation is even worse during summer when the pub's back doors are open. I cannot have my windows open and have to suffer like a prisoner in my own flat.
- The noise starts when the bands come in between 19:00-20:00 and start their sound check and rehearsals.
- The live music is played between 21:00 to 23:30 and sometimes till midnight.
- The noise then continues after the music finished when people are leaving.
- On the nights when live music is performed, the pub seem to attract different crowd that come out drunk and terrorise the neighbourhood by smashing bins, shouting and behaving violently. I dare not leave my flat at this time.
- Although I have tried to call the pub many times to ask them to turn the music volume down, they never pick up the phone (I suppose that can't hear it ringing).
