### KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

Implemented and delivered the Community Centre Transformation programme.

Secured health funding to support the delivery of Community Development work through our partnerships with East Surrey Place and Surrey County Council.

Managed and delivered the health funded 'Creating Healthy Communities' grants. Securing **£134,000** of funding for the voluntary sector in East Surrey Place.

Supported the voluntary sector to respond to cost-ofliving pressures. Distributing **£298,000** of the Household Support Fund (total across all rounds) via voluntary sector partners to the benefit of residents.

### **Community Centre Development 2023/24**



- Following the successful implementation of the transformation programme, the community centre team are now moving into business planning for 2023/24.
- Improvement still required of internal infrastructure and processes such as tills, booking system and centre facilities to improve efficiency, resource and increase income.
- To continue to work in conjunction with partners internal and external to provide support for communities, targeting those most vulnerable.
- To increase the breadth of our low-cost activity programme that supports resident wellbeing.
- To continue to empower and engage with communities so activities and services are shaped by community need.

# Cost of Living

#### **Food Poverty**

•7,341 visits to our five food clubs helping local people make their money go further and reducing food waste.

#### Fuel Poverty

- We have helped Horley Lions establish a long-term fuel poverty project and have supported local organisations to distribute energy top ups.
- We have obtained funding from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund to further develop our fuel poverty response and allow us to offer energy saving gadgets to reduce energy use rather than just offering top ups.

#### **Household Support Fund**

- Worked with the Voluntary Sector to enable the Household Support Fund to reach residents in need.
- The Household Support Fund has been provided to residents in a variety of ways but the Voluntary Sector has been a key enabler to ensure the funding reaches those most in need.

#### **Circle of Support Model**

• Working with Loveworks, we have developed a model of support for food club and foodbank users in Woodhatch and Merstham which has increased access to services offering help with cost of living pressures.



- Improving voluntary sector involvement in health creation via the Creating Healthy Communities Grants. This included establishing a resident-led participation group that provided feedback on grant applications.
- Utilising community centres as a delivery space for prevention and communities work.
- Community development and the Growing Health Together partnership working to improve wider determinants of health in key neighbourhoods.
- Connecting communities approach that has enabled residents and the voluntary sector to be more central in the development of services.
- Taking a lead on the Communities and Prevention strand of the East Surrey Place objectives

## Health & Place Based Working SURREYDOWNS Health & Care Partnership

- Work to increase the uptake of COVID vaccinations in the North of the Borough (which took the area out of the bottom 20% of uptake into the average range) has now led on to work to support communities to recover from the impact of the pandemic particularly focusing on mental wellbeing.
- Supporting a prevention grants programme similar to what has been achieved in East Surrey (this has included securing funding for a sensory garden, a project the Preston CDW is leading on).
- Better Care funding secured to enable the IRIS (identification and referral to improve safety) programme to be expanded into the north of Reigate & Banstead. IRIS is an evidenced based programme that works with GP practices to increase understanding of domestic abuse and opportunities for doctors to spot patterns and engage patients who may be at risk with a local support advocate.
